

- Number of sessions





 - Vs. Spanish, Math, Business, etc.



Challenge 2: Service Underutilization

- Students and Teachers may simply not know
 - We give teachers too much credit sometimes
 - Culture of higher education \Rightarrow teachers are busy
- Japanese is mandatory for our JAPN 1201 (Elm 1), but afterwards...
- Students confuse Tutors with their Language Assistants (LAs)
 - LAs offer Drop-in and can help with homework



The Problem

Tutors of less conventional subjects have <u>limited resources</u> available and must deal with an <u>underutilization of services</u>

What Can We Do?

Establish Connections

- Rapport Building
 - Formal cass visits
 - Informal conversing with students, attending professor's office hours
- Organize events
 - E.g., Language Roundtable
- Collaborate with programs
 - E.g., My Japanese Program internship

Language Roundtable (Fall 2022)

- Noticed a lack of student self-efficacy, esp. speaking skills
- Two Possibilities
 - Limited opportunities to create with language
 - Emphasis on grammatical accuracy in class
- Goal: Create an external space for students to practice their language abilities in an ungraded environment
- Planned games that encourage conversation




How confident are you in your language skills ? ^{10 responses}

Survey Results

- 10 Responses
- 100% enjoyment
- "I enjoyed how we were all encouraged to participate and felt the environment was non-judgemental, which encouraged me to speak out more"

Collaborate with Programs: Internship

- Cause: Colleges on campus are removing the FL requirement
- 3 Facets
 - Recruitment
 - Retention
 - Community Building
- Activities
 - Research and analyze enrollment data
 - Plan/Execute visits to K12 programs for promotion
 - Coordinate events
 - "Professions in Japan" Speaker Series
 - Connect students to other collegiate programs

Other Tips and Strategies

- Keep learning
 - Learn more about your subject
 - Try learning a new subject
 - Helps develop empathy
- Professional Development
 - CRLA, Conferences, etc.
 - Books
- NETWORK!
 - Especially OUTSIDE the classroom/tutoring session
- Ask for help AND Pay it forward
 - Help the tutors coming after you
